BLOCKING OF INCOMING CALLS TO PROSTITUTES WHO ADVERTISE  
IN PHONE-BOXES

We wish to know the reason for this denial of the right of free expression by phone. Prostitution is perfectly lawful and it is thus permissible for persons engaged in that profession to seek clients.

The blocking of calls is a dangerous precedent for preventing citizens using telecommunications for legitimate purposes. We accordingly ask you to reverse your decision to start doing so in September 1996.
