Dear Mr Goodman,

I am writing with regard to your letter, addressed to the Chairman, which has been passed to me for reply, concerning illicit advertising in public payphones.

Firstly, I would like to explain BT's aim is to put the customer first. This sort of advertising in BT kiosks is a growing problem. It creates an unsightly mess, causes offence to customers and local residents, obscures important notices in payphone kiosks such as emergency service instructions and creates a litter problem.

I would like to reiterate that the increasingly explicit and graphic nature of prostitutes' cards is offensive to so many people. Parents are particularly concerned about the display of the cards to children which may dissuade them from using a payphone, even in urgent circumstances. The cards portray an unrepresentative, unsavoury image of the surrounding locality to residents, business people and tourists.

We have recently been working closely with the Office of Telecommunications (Oftel), as well as with other telecommunications service providers, Westminster City Council and the Metropolitian Police to resolve the problem of illicit advertising. This has resulted in the proposal to bar incoming calls to numbers which are persistently advertised in our kiosks, without our permission.

I am sorry that our planned action to resolve, what is perceived by a great many people as a problem, does not meet your approval. However, I hope you can accept that we must listen to the views of the majority of our customers.
