Sir,

YOUR STATEMENT OF 15TH NOV REGARDING TELEVISED PORN
You declared "hard core pornography, in whatever medium,
is unacceptable." That is absurd. Hard core pornography is now
lawful throughout Europe, from Spain to Russia. It has been
legitimate in Denmark and the Netherlands since 1966, in West
Germany since 1974 and in France since 1975, without ill
effect. As Jacques Lang, the French Mionister of Culture,
declared "The State has no right to prevent citizens from
seeing what they choose."

You also stated that there is "no place for hard core pornography in a society which cares about children." That is also absurd, as it means the denial of access by adults to material which is unsuitable for children-the ultimate communist nanny state! That premise is based on the false assumption that British parents are uniquiely incapable of controlling viewing by their offspring.

You mentioned the powers under the Broadcasting Act 1990. Why did you ignore the Braodcasting Act 1996?
