5) To reduce the risk of virus contamination, please do not send ~~any~~ links.

6) If you have an e-mail address, please let me have it.

Proposed Content of a CAC website

I suggest that a CAC website should contain the following:

1. CAC logo/letterhead
2. contents list
3. introduction - statement of aims
4. what CAC is not and does not do eg. CAC is not a charity, CAC does not give free legal advice.
5. links
6. briefings and policy documents
7. newsletter - to be updated regularly
8. CAC's postal address, phone number and e-mail address
