TED GOODMAN HAS BEEN CHAIR OF THE CAMPAIGN AGAINST CENSORSHIP FOR OVER TEN YEARS AND IS ALSO A MEMBER OF THE NATIONAL CAMPAIGN FOR THE REFORM OF THE OBSCENE PUBLICATIONS ACTS. HE HELPED ORGANISE THE LONGLASTING OPPOSITION TO FILM AND VIDEO CENSORSHIP WHICH FINALLY CULMINATED IN THE NEW GUIDELINES ADOPTED BY THE BRITISH BOARD OF FILM CLASSIFICATION IN 2000, PERMITTING HARD-CORE MATERIAL IN THE R18 CATEGORY.

GOODMAN ALSO SERVED A TERM ON THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE NATIONAL COUNCIL FOR CIVIL LIBERTIES (NOW RENAMED "LIBERTY) AND HAS HAD ONE BOOK ("BRITAIN AN UNFREE COUNTRY") PUBLISHED, AS WELL AS MANY ARTICLES IN PERIODICALS. A LAWYER BY PROFESSION, HE GIVES TALKS ON LEGAL REFORM, AND HAS DEFENDED PEOPLE CHARGED WITH OBSCENITY.

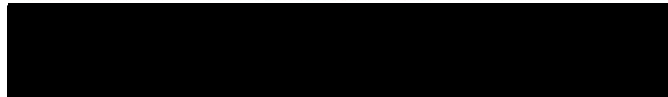
